

Winter Irrigation Tips

Now that we are well into the fall season, the City of Horseshoe Bay Utilities Department would like to remind residents that it is time to consider shutting down irrigation systems for winter.

Reasons to Winterize Your Irrigation System

- **Avoid wasting water:** The weather is cooler and established lawns and landscape plants are going dormant. Landscapes generally don't need more water than the weather provides during the winter months.
- **Protect irrigation components:** This is an opportune time to cover outside hose spigots and insulate backflow prevention devices before any potentially freezing temperatures hit the Horseshoe Bay area. When water freezes, it expands. This expansion puts immense pressure on pipes, valves, and sprinkler heads, causing them to crack or burst. You should also remove batteries from controllers and store them in a dry place.
- **Avoid costly repairs:** Ignoring winterization can lead to expensive repairs in the spring to replace cracked pipes, damaged sprinkler heads, and malfunctioning valves.
- **Protect from landscape damage:** Leaks from frozen pipes can saturate your lawn, leading to muddy areas, soil erosion, and even potential foundation issues.
- **Ensure a smooth start in the spring:** A winterized system is less likely to have issues like low water pressure, leaks, or non-functioning sprinkler heads when you turn it back on.

Should a hard freeze become imminent in the forecast, residents should consider shutting off the main water supply and draining all water from the system to prevent freeze damage in addition to insulating exposed pipes, valves, and backflow preventers. Don't forget to turn off the controller or timer!

By taking the necessary steps to winterize your irrigation system, you protect your investment and ensure it is ready to operate efficiently when the weather is warm again.

To be clear, there is no prohibition on watering in the fall and winter, but why not conserve water and save on utility bills? Residents may return to regular watering on March 1. Currently, Horseshoe Bay is in the Stage 1, twice-per-week watering schedule. View your scheduled watering days by visiting www.horseshoe-bay-tx.gov/stage1.
